

race /reɪs/ races, racing, raced

Someone **races against** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្រកួតប្រជែងទល់នឹងអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

She has raced against some of the best runners.

rage /reɪdʒ/ rages, raging, raged

Someone **rages about** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់និយាយខឹងយ៉ាងខ្លាំងអំពីអ្វីមួយ

She raged about corruption.

raring /reəriŋ/ (adjective)

Someone is **raring to do** something

Someone is very eager to do something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានអារម្មណ៍អន្ទះសាចង់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They were raring to fight for more victories.

rattle /rætl/ rattles, rattling, rattled

1. Someone **rattles on about** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់និយាយអំពីអ្វីមួយ

Some of the women would rattle on about sex.

2. Someone **rattles on about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់និយាយអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They rattled on about working with stupid children.

ready /redi/ (adjective)

1. Someone is **ready to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ត្រៀមខ្លួនជាស្រេចដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

The couple is ready to move house in order to get work.

She was ready to cry.

Some of the women were ready to move houses in order to get work.

2. Someone is **ready for** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ត្រៀមខ្លួនជាស្រេចដើម្បីអ្វីមួយ

I am not sure she is ready for this level of responsibility.

3. Someone is **ready for doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ត្រៀមខ្លួនជាស្រេចដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

He is ready for getting such a job.

reckon /rekən/ reckons, reckoning, reckoned

Something is **reckoned to do** something else

អ្វីមួយត្រូវមានអ្វីមួយទៀតកើតឡើង

About 40 per cent of the country is reckoned to be illiterate.

recommend /rekəmənd/ **recommends, recommending, recommended**

Someone **recommends** something to someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ផ្តល់យោបល់អំពីអ្វីមួយដល់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

He recommended the final draft of report to my research team.

recompense /rekəmpens/ **recompenses, recompensing, recompensed**

Someone **recompenses** someone else for something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទូទាត់សងអ្វីមួយដល់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

We had to recompense the farmers for the loss of their cows.

reconcile /rekənsail/ **reconciles, reconciling, reconciled**

Someone is **reconciled with** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ត្រូវបានបង្រួបបង្រួមជាមួយអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

They had been reconciled with their families.

reconciled /rekənsaild/ (adjective)

Someone is **reconciled to** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់យល់ព្រមទទួលយកអ្វីមួយ

After a while, she was reconciled to the situation.

recruit /rikru:t/ **recruits, recruiting, recruited**

1. Someone **recruits** someone else for an organization

Someone gets someone else to work for an organization

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ជ្រើសរើសអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតឱ្យចូលធ្វើការនៅក្នុងអង្គការណាមួយ

The organization director recruited a few young people to for the organization.

2. Someone **recruits** someone else to do something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ជ្រើសរើសអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតឱ្យធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

The Royal Navy announced that women would be recruited to serve on its warship at sea.

reduce /ridju:s/ **reduces, reducing, reduced**

Someone is **reduced to doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ត្រូវតែធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They are reduced to begging in the streets.

Many of the youngsters are reduced to sleeping on the streets.

refer /rifɜ:/ **refers, referring, referred**

1. Someone **refers to** someone else by a name

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ហៅអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតចំឈ្មោះ

We had better not refer to the company director by name.

2. Someone **refers to** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់និយាយយោងដល់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

In his letters he rarely referred to politicians.

reference /refə'reɪn/ **references** (noun)

Someone **makes a reference to** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់និយាយយោងទៅដល់អ្វីមួយ

He made no reference on his arrival to the latest development in South Africa.

refund /ri:fʌnd/ **refunds, refunding, refunded**

Someone **refunds** money to someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សងលុយទៅឱ្យអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

Medical practitioners had refunded some money to the patients.

refuse /rifju:s/ **refuses, refusing, refused**

1. Someone **refuses to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បដិសេធធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They refused to accept this recommendation.

She refused to reveal the name of her informant.

We refused to accept the blame for something that was someone else's fault.

2. Someone **refuses** someone else something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បដិសេធការធ្វើអ្វីមួយរបស់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

Only the minister could refuse him a loan.

regale /rigeɪl/ **regales, regaling, regaled**

Someone **regales** someone else **with** a story or joke

អ្នកណាម្នាក់និយាយប្រាប់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតអំពីរឿងកំប្លែងលេង

After the meeting, they regaled the young attendants with stories.

regard /rigə:d/ **regards, regarding, regarded**

1. Someone **regards** something as another thing

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ចាត់ទុកអ្វីមួយថាជាអ្វីមួយទៀត

I regard it as one of my masterpieces.

2. Someone **regards** someone else as another one

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ចាត់ទុកអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតថាជាអ្នកណា

We regard our children as film stars.

regret /rɪɡrɛt/ **regrets, regretting, regretted**

Someone **regrets doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សោកស្តាយដោយការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

Afterwards we regretted having spoken to our colleagues.

Do you regret leaving school so young?

She doesn't regret working at the bank.

reject /ridʒekt/ **rejects, rejecting, rejected**

Someone **rejects to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បដិសេធធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They rejected to work with him.

rejoice /ridʒɔis/ **rejoices, rejoicing, rejoiced**

1. Someone **rejoices in** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សប្បាយរីករាយយ៉ាងខ្លាំងនឹងអ្វីមួយ

All his colleagues gathered to rejoice in his freedom.

We rejoiced in the success of our troops.

2. Someone **rejoices in doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សប្បាយរីករាយយ៉ាងខ្លាំងនឹងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

All his colleagues rejoiced in attending the wedding party.

release /rili:s/ **releases, releasing, released**

Someone is **released from** prison

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ត្រូវបានដោះលែងចេញពីគុក

They had just released from prison.

reliant /rilaiənt/ (adjective)

Someone is **reliant upon** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ពឹងផ្អែកលើអ្វីមួយ

They were completely reliant upon the government for assistance.

relinquish /rɪlɪŋkwɪʃ/ **relinquishes, relinquishing, relinquished**

Someone **relinquishes** something such as **authority** or **responsibility**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បោះបង់ចោលអ្វីមួយដូចជាសិទ្ធិអំណាច ឬការទទួលខុសត្រូវណាមួយ

I relinquished the editorship of the newspaper and bulletin.

rely /rilai/ **relies, relying, relied**

1. Someone **relies on** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ពឹងផ្អែកលើអ្វីមួយ

Some non-governmental organizations rely on the government for finance.

2. Some **relies on** someone else **to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ពឹងផ្អែកទៅលើអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

The general could rely on their troops to obey order.

remember /rɪmɛmbə/ **remembers, remembering, remembered**

1. Someone **remembers doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ចងចាំថាបានធ្វើអ្វីមួយ (ធ្វើអ្វីមួយនៅអតីតកាល)

I remember meeting her for the first time in 2000.

2. Someone **remembers to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ចងចាំថានឹងធ្វើអ្វីមួយ (ធ្វើអ្វីមួយនៅអនាគត)

I remember to go to the Bank.

remind /rɪmaɪnd/ **reminds, reminding, reminded**

1. Someone **reminds** someone else **about** something

Someone **reminds** someone else **of** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់រំលឹកអ្នកណាម្នាក់អំពីអ្វីមួយ

She reminded me of two appointments.

2. Someone **reminds** someone else **about doing** something

Someone **reminds** someone else **of doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់រំលឹកអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

You reminded me of getting more bread.

3. Someone **reminds** someone else **to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់រំលឹកអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតឱ្យធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

My mother reminded me to talk to her about my marriage.

remove /rɪmu:v/ **removes, removing, removed**

Someone **removes** someone else **from a group** such as a **committee**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បញ្ឈប់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតចេញពីក្រុម ដូចជាគណៈកម្មាធិការជាដើម

They made an attempt to remove him from the club.

render /rɛndə/ **renders, rendering, rendered**

Someone **renders assistance** to someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ផ្តល់ជំនួយដល់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

The government rendered the humanitarian assistance to the urban poor communities.

renege /rɪni:ɡ/ **reneges, reneging, reneged**

Someone **reneges on an agreement** or **promise**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មិនបានរក្សាកិច្ចព្រមព្រៀង ឬការសន្យាណាមួយ

He had to return \$2000 because he had reneged on the agreement.

reply /rɪplai/ **replies, replying, replied**

Someone **reports to** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ឆ្លើយតបទៅនឹងអ្វីមួយ

You haven't replied to my question yet.

report /rɪpɔ:t/ **reports, reporting, reported**

1. Someone **reports on** an event or subject

អ្នកណាម្នាក់រាយការណ៍ស្តីពីព្រឹត្តិការណ៍ ឬប្រធានបទណាមួយ

The committee investigated and reported on the complaint.

2. Someone **reports** someone else to an **authority**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់រាយការណ៍អំពីអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៅកាន់អាជ្ញាធរណាមួយ

You should have reported them to the police.

request /rɪkwest/ **requests, requesting, requests**

1. Someone **requests** someone else to **do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ធ្វើសំណើដល់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

Thailand has formally requested Vietnam to use its influence to secure the release of a Thai worker.

2. Someone **makes a request for** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ធ្វើសេចក្តីស្នើសុំអ្វីមួយ

They made repeated requests for money.

require /rɪkwaɪə/ **requires, requiring, required**

Someone **requires** someone else to **do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់តម្រូវឱ្យអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

All the boys were required to study religion.

We require you to be in the office by 8 o'clock.

Students are required to study at least one foreign language.

resign /rɪzain/ **resigns, resigning, resigned**

Someone **resigns from** a job or position

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សុំលាលែងពីការងារ ឬមុខតំណែងណាមួយ

She resigned from the Government.

resist /rɪzɪst/ **resists, resisting, resisted**

Someone **resists doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មិនព្រមធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

I can't resist teasing him.

resolution /rɪzɔːljʊ:ʃn/ **resolutions** (noun)

Someone **makes a resolution to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ធ្វើសេចក្តីសំរេចចិត្តនៅក្នុងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

I have made my resolution to stop smoking.

resolve /rɪzɒlv/ **resolves, resolving, resolved**

Someone **resolves to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សំរេចចិត្តធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They resolved to tell the truth.

He had resolved to confront him about such an issue.

resolved /rɪzɒlvd/ (adjective)

Someone is **resolved to do** something

Someone is determined to do something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្តេជ្ញាចិត្តដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They were firmly resolved to talk to her about the projects.

respond /rɪspɒnd/ **responds, responding, responded**

Someone **responds to** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ឆ្លើយតបទៅនឹងអ្វីមួយ

The government has responded to pressure by moving towards reform.

responsibility /rɪspɒnsəbɪləti/ **responsibilities** (noun)

1. Someone **has responsibility for** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានការទទួលខុសត្រូវចំពោះអ្វីមួយ

She has the responsibility for the project.

2. Someone **has a responsibility to** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានភារកិច្ចដើម្បីជួយអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

We have a responsibility to our children to give them our love and our attention.

3. Someone **takes responsibility to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានការទទួលខុសត្រូវធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

He took responsibility to hold the international conference on the poverty alleviation.

responsible /rɪspɒnsəbəl/ (adjective)

Someone is **responsible for doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទទួលខុសត្រូវចំពោះការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

Some researchers are responsible for ordering new reports.

reticent /rɪtɪsənt/ (adjective)

1. Someone is **reticent about** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មិនសូវនិយាយច្រើនអំពីអ្វីមួយ

The government officials were reticent about tourism development plan.

2. Someone is **reticent about doing** something.

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មិនសូវនិយាយច្រើនអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

He was rather inticent about giving information on his research methodology.

reunite /ri:ju:nait/ reunites, reuniting, reunited

Someone is **reunited with** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ជួបជុំ ឬរួបរួមគ្នាឡើងវិញនឹងអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

He was reunited with his wife and two sons at Phnom Penh airport.

revel /revl/ revels, revelling, revelled,

1. Someone **revels in** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សប្បាយរីករាយនឹងអ្វីមួយ

They seemed to revel in their proposals.

2. Someone **revels in doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សប្បាយរីករាយនឹងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They revelled in learning Khmer history.

revenge /rivendʒ/ revenges, revenging, revenged

Someone **revenges oneself on** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ធ្វើការសងសឹកអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

She will revenge herself on those who helped him to escape.

right /rait/ rights (noun)

1. Someone is **right to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានហេតុផលត្រឹមត្រូវធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We were right to insist on certain reforms.

I don't think you are right to leave your children alone in a flat.

2. Someone is **right about** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់គិតត្រឹមត្រូវអំពីអ្វីមួយ

We are right about the repairs, which the house needed.

3. Someone is **right about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់គិតត្រឹមត្រូវអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

You were right about building this house.

4. Someone **has a right to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានសិទ្ធិដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We have rights to resist unfair pressure.

risk /rɪsk/ risks, risking, risked

1. Someone **risks doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្រថុយគ្រោះថ្នាក់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We risk leaving the decision to the last minute.

If you have an expensive rug, don't risk washing it yourself.

Could we risk leaving the decision to the last minute?

2. Someone **runs the risk of doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្រថុយគ្រោះថ្នាក់នៅក្នុងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They run the risk of confusing the voters.

roaring /rɔːrɪŋ/ (noun)

Someone is **doing a roaring trade**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្រកបមុខរបរណាមួយកាក់កបយ៉ាងខ្លាំង

The seller in Toul Tompong market is doing a roaring trade.

root /ruːt/ roots, rooting, rooted

1. Someone **roots for** someone else.

អ្នកណាម្នាក់គាំទ្រអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

This is where the Tiger Cup will be played and I will be rooting for Cambodia.

2. Someone **roots someone else out**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ដកអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតចេញ

He is in there somewhere. Let's go and root him out.

rope /rəʊp/ ropes, roping, roped

1. Someone **ropes one thing to another**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ចងភ្ជាប់អ្វីមួយទៅនឹងអ្វីមួយទៀត

His body was roped to the hospital bed.

2. Someone **ropes someone else into doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បញ្ជូនអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតឱ្យជួយធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They were roped into helping with the barbecue.

3. Someone **ropes someone else in to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បញ្ជូនអ្នកណាម្នាក់ឱ្យជួយធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

Teachers rope college students in to buy new book published by the college.

rouse /raʊs/ rouse, rousing, roused

Someone **rouses oneself to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ក្រោកដឹងខ្លួន (ពីដំណេក) ដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

He roused himself to talk to his mother.

ruminare /ruːmineɪt/ ruminates, ruminating, ruminated

1. Someone **reflects about** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សម្រេចចិត្តអំពីអ្វីមួយ

Members of all parties reflected about the country economic crisis.

2. Someone **reflects about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សម្រេចចិត្តអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We reflected about organizing the campaign against world hunger.

We reflected about organizing a concert in the village hall.

run /rʌn/ runs, running, run

1. Someone **runs across** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ជួបអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតដោយ ចៃដន្យ

I run across my old students.

2. Someone **runs off with** someone else

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ពង្រត់អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀត

Her husband runs off with another woman last year.

3. Someone **runs out of** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មិនមានអ្វីនៅសល់សោះ

We were rapidly running out of money

rush /rʌʃ/ rushes, rushing, rushed

1. Someone **rushes to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្រញាប់ប្រញាល់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We rushed to buy the newspaper.

People all over the country are rushing to buy a copy of his new book.

2. Someone **rushes** someone else **into doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ធ្វើឱ្យអ្នកណាម្នាក់ទៀតប្រញាប់ប្រញាល់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

Don't let them rush you into making a foolish decision.

Do not be rushed into parting with goods before taking legal advice.

3. **There is no rush to do** something

មិនចាំបាច់ប្រញាប់ប្រញាល់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយខ្លាំងពេកនោះទេ

There was no rush to meet her at the university.

4. **There is no rush for** someone **to do** something

មិនចាំបាច់ឱ្យអ្នកណាម្នាក់ប្រញាប់ប្រញាល់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយខ្លាំងពេកនោះទេ

There was no rush for him to declare his own candidacy.

sack /sæk/ sacks, sacking, sacked

Someone **sacks** someone else **from a job**

អ្នកណាម្នាក់បណ្តេញអ្នកណាម្នាក់ឲ្យត្រឡប់ពីការងារណាមួយ

Three workers were sacked from the work because they would not join a union.

sad /sæd/ sadder, saddest

Someone is **sad to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មិនសប្បាយចិត្តនឹងធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

I was very sad to leave school so young.

sanguine /sæŋɡwin/ (adjective)

Someone is **sanguine about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានជំនឿជាក់ទៅលើការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They were sanguine about learning English in university.

satisfied /sætɪsfaɪd/ (adjective)

1. Someone is **satisfied with** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សប្បាយរីករាយនឹងអ្វីមួយ

He was well satisfied with the success of the exams.

2. Someone is **satisfied with doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សប្បាយរីករាយនឹងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We were satisfied with visiting many ancient temples in Siem Reap last year.

save /seɪv/ saves, saving, saved

1. Someone **saves money to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សន្សំលុយកាក់ដើម្បីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They managed to save enough money to buy a house.

2. Someone **saves** someone else **from doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ជួយអ្នកណាម្នាក់ឲ្យត្រឡប់ពីធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They saved me from denying the project.

She just managed to save herself from falling.

3. Someone **saves doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ជួយធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

Students saved writing up thousands of textbooks.

say /seɪ/ says, saying, said

1. Someone **has a say in** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានសិទ្ធិផ្តល់មតិយោបល់ចំពោះអ្វីមួយ

Teachers have had little say in the new curriculum.

2. Someone **has a say in doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានសិទ្ធិផ្តល់មតិយោបល់នៅក្នុងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ
You have no say in carrying out such a project.

scared /skeəd/ (adjective)

1. Someone is **scared of doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ភ័យខ្លាចនៅក្នុងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ
They were scared of making a fool of themselves.

2. Someone is **scared to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ភ័យខ្លាចមិនហ៊ានធ្វើអ្វីមួយ
Young people are too scared to apply for travel documents.

scathing /skeɪdɪŋ/ (adjective)

Someone is **scathing about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់រិះគន់យ៉ាងខ្លាំងអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ
They were scathing about carrying out the enforcement of discipline.

scavenge /skævɪndʒ/ **scavenges, scavenging, scavenged**

Someone **scavenges for** food or things

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ដើររើសម្ហូប ឬរបស់របរផ្សេងៗ
It is thought they were trying to scavenge for military equipment.

sceptical /skeptɪkl/ (adjective)

Someone is **sceptical about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់សង្ស័យអំពីការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ
They were sceptical about forming an organization.

scholarship /skɒləʃɪp/ **scholarships** (noun)

1. Someone **gets scholarship** to a school or university

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ទទួលបានអាហាររូបករណ៍ពីសាលារៀន ឬសាកលវិទ្យាល័យណាមួយ
He was a lucky man to get scholarship to the Royal University of Fine Arts.

2. Someone **applies for** a **scholarship to study...**

Someone is **willing to do** something

The government officials said they were willing to discuss a limited halt in the fighting if the guerrillas made a formal request.

wish /wɪʃ/ **wishes, wishing, wished**

Someone **wishes to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានបំណងធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

They are in love and wish to marry.

We do not wish to discuss the matter further.

withdraw /wɪdɹə:/ **withdraws, withdrawing, withdrew, withdrawn**

1. Someone **withdraws** money **from** a bank account

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ដកលុយពីគណនេយ្យធនាគារណាមួយ

They must present their cheque cards when they withdraw any money from the bank accounts.

2. Someone **withdraws support from** someone else

In 1985 the government withdrew support from people who lived abroad.

wonder /wʌndə/ **wonders, wondering, wondered**

1. Someone **wonders about doing** something

We are beginning to wonder about attending the conference on tourism strategic plan.

2. Someone **wonders at** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ភ្ញាក់ភ្ញើលើនឹងអ្វីមួយ

We wondered at her knowledge of income-tax legislation. I don't wonder at his strength.

3. Someone **wonders at doing** something

We don't wonder at visiting to Thailand.

wont /wəʊnt/ (adjective)

Someone is **wont to do** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានទំលាប់ធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

She had herself many of the failings she was wont to criticize in other people.

worried /wʌrɪd/ (adjective)

Someone is **worried about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ខ្វល់ខ្វាយនឹងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We were very worried about taking the exam.

worry /wʌrɪ/ **worries, worrying, worried**

Someone **worries about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់ខ្វល់ខ្វាយនឹងការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

We worry about having missions around the world.

wrong /wrɒŋ/ (adjective)

Someone is **wrong about doing** something

អ្នកណាម្នាក់មានកំហុសខ្ពស់ចំពោះការធ្វើអ្វីមួយ

He was quite wrong about expressing his concern at the possibility of war.
